## ABOUT CHENNAI

Chennai is the capital of the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. Located on the Coromandel Coast off the Bay of Bengal, it is one of the biggest cultural, economic and educational centres in South India. According to the 2011 Indian census, it is the sixth-largest city and fourth-most populous urban agglomeration in India. The city together with the adjoining regions, constitute the Chennai Metropolitan Area, which is the 36th-largest urban area by population in the world. Chennai is among the most visited Indian cities by foreign tourists. It was ranked the 43rd most visited city in the world for the year 2015. The Quality of Living Survey rated Chennai as the safest city in India. Chennai attracts 45 percent of health tourists visiting India and 30 to 40 percent of domestic health tourists. As such, it is termed "India's health capital". As a growing metropolitan city in a developing country, Chennai confronts substantial pollution and other logistical and socio-economic problems. Chennai had the third-largest expatriate population in India at 35,000 in 2009, 82,790 in 2011 and estimated at over 100,000 by 2016. Tourism guide publisher Lonely Planet named Chennai as one of the top ten cities in the world to visit in 2015. Chennai is ranked as a beta-level city in the Global Cities Index, and was ranked the best city in India by India Today in the 2014 annual Indian city survey. In 2015 Chennai was named the "hottest" city (worth visiting and worth living in for long term) by the BBC, citing the mixture of both modern and traditional values. National Geographic ranked Chennai's food as second best in the world; it was the only Indian city to feature in the list. Chennai was also named the ninth-best cosmopolitan city in the world by Lonely Planet. In October 2017, Chennai was added to the UNESCO Creative Cities Network (UCCN) list for its rich musical tradition.

The Chennai Metropolitan Area is one of the largest city economies of India. Chennai is nicknamed "The Detroit of India", with more than one-third of India's automobile industry being based in the city. In January 2015, it was ranked third in terms of per capita GDP. Chennai has been selected as one of the 100 Indian cities to be developed as a smart city under Smart Cities Mission.

## ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University was established by the Government of Tamil Nadu by an Act of State Legislature [Act No. 43 of 1997] for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge in learning, teaching and research in the field of law. It strives hard to develop in the students and research scholars, a sense of responsibility to serve the society in the field of law by developing skills in advocacy, legal services, legislation and law reforms through better educational instruction and research facilities.

The University is recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) (under Sec. 2 (f) & 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956). The University is a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi. It is functioning as a nodal agency to improve legal education in the State of Tamil Nadu. During its short existence, the School of Excellence in Law (SOEL) run by the University has emerged as one of the premier Law Schools in the country. All the Ten Government Law Colleges in the State of Tamil Nadu located at Chennai, Madurai, Thiruchirapalli, Coimbatore, Tirunelveli, Chengalpattu, Vellore, Villupuram, Dharmapuri, Ramanathapuram, The Central Law College [Private] at Salem and Saraswathi Law College [Private] at Tindivanam are affiliated to the Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University.

The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University is a first and unique affiliating type of Law University established in South Asia. There are more than twelve thousand students pursuing their law degrees in this University through eight affiliated law colleges in addition to SOEL. From the first batch of SOEL, nearly 11 students appointed as judicial officers in their first attempt. In India, there are around 1000 institutions offering legal education. This University has been ranked as one of the top 25 law institutions in the country. The University feels proud that it is the only affiliating type of State Law University in that list.



## **LOCATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE**

Chennai, formerly known as Madras is the Capital City of the State of Tamil Nadu. Chennai is the fourth largest Metropolitan city of India. It is the Gateway of South India. The city also known as the Detroit of South Asia, is a large commercial and industrial centre, and is known for its cultural heritage and temple architecture.

The Tamil Nadu Dr.Ambedkar Law University has two campuses at present. One is situated at No.5, Poompozhil, Dr.D.G.S.Dhinakaran Salai, Raja Annamalaipuram, Chennai - 600 028 between the Music College and Iyyappan Temple [MRC Nagar] on the banks of Adyar river and has been functioning from its establishment in the year 1997. The other campus, the new one is at M.G.R Salai, near MRTS Taramani Railway Station, Perungudi, Chennai - 600 113 constructed in 15 acres of land with the financial assistance of Rs.59.27 crores of the Government of Tamil Nadu. The new campus was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu on 14.02.2016. While the administrative affairs of the University has been retained in the Poompozhil campus, the academic activities offered in the School of Excellence in Law has started functioning from the Taramani campus with effect from 22.02.2016. Both the campuses of the University are located in prime localities of the Chennai city and are well connected by Road, Rail and Air. The High Court Complex, District, Sessions and City Civil Courts are within 15 kilometers from the University campus and this facilitates easy and effective interaction between the Bench, Bar and the Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University. The Tamil Nadu State Judicial Academy and Anna Institute of Management are located just 0.5 Km from the Poompozhil campus. The jurisdiction of the University covers the entire State of Tamil Nadu. All the Law Colleges are affiliated to this University. As a full-fledged first affiliating Law University in the Country, the University has plans to expand its academic tenets to cover all parts of the Country in general and the State of Tamil Nadu in particular by increasing the enrolment for its various distance learning programmes in order to equip the people with legal knowledge. The Government have also allotted another piece of land at Tambaram village for future expansion activities.

#### **Internet Connectivity**

The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University has 1GB, 155 Mbps of broadband connectivity with 100 Mbps download and 55 Mbps upload speed under NMEICT project of MHRD.

JSTOR is actively preserving over two thousand academic journals in both digital and print formats, and continues to expand access to scholarly works and other materials needed for research and teaching globally.

## **Library Automation**

The University library is automated with Radio Frequency Identification Detention (RFID) Technology. The Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is available through Internet and Intranet. The University Library has MOU with UGC SHODCANGA and digitized. The Thesis submitted by research scholar of the Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University has been published in the INFLIBNET portal to avoid the duplication of research activities.

## **Online Legal Resources**

The University library provides access to the following online legal resources in the campus.

### **Hein Online**

Hein Online is Hein's premier Online research product with more than 60 million pages of legal history available in an Online, fully-searchable, image- based format. Hein Online bridges the gap in legal history by providing comprehensive coverage from inception of more than 1,400 law and law- related periodicals.

### **Westlaw**

It provides access to the complete archives of decisions delivered by the Supreme Court of India, the High Courts and Tribunals, Bare Acts from 1836 till date. Westlaw India includes a comprehensive archive of all Rules and Regulations produced from 1890 till date. Along with this, Westlaw India also contains vast libraries of international content, including the United Kingdom, United States, the European Union, Australia, Canada, Hong Kong and South Africa. It has a collection of journals from Sweet & Maxwell, Oxford University Press, Cambridge University Press and Tottel Publishing amongst others.

### **SCC Online Web Edition**

SCC Online , pioneered the availability of electronic legal research resources in India in 1996 through introduction of its CD-ROM based software. In addition to our extensive coverage of Indian case law from the Supreme Court of India, all High Courts, Tribunals and Commissions as well as Statutory Law and Secondary Materials, SCC Online also contains legal information from several Foreign Jurisdictions and covers important International Law. With a collection of over 300 databases, with more than 2.08 million documents and over 13.5 million pages our legal research resource provides top quality information with an interface which makes legal research a quicker, easier and more effective process..

### **Legal Information Institute of India (LII of India)**

The LII of India is an institute established in India to provide free online access to legal resources of Indian legislations of the Central, State and Union Territories with case laws and academic legal resources. The online access also provides information on treaties of India. LII of India at present has 145 databases, including over 30,000 decisions from 37 Courts and Tribunals, Indian national legislations from 1836, bilateral treaties, law reform reports and about law journal's articles. The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University is one among the partner institutions.

### **Placement Cell**

The University has a Placement Cell in the School of Excellence in Law with an aim to help the young students secure jobs in good corporate (National and Multinational Corporations) and other important premier legal agencies through the Cell.

The companies visited our campus and gave an introduction about their firm and nature of the work. The recruitment process includes written test (either online or in person), group discussion and personal interview. The location of the placement varies like Pune, Madurai, Chennai, Coimbatore etc.. The Placement Committee also conducted pre placement orientation programme for the final year students of 5 year integrated B.A.LL.B and 3 year LL.B (Hons) degree courses.

### **Moot Court Association [MCA]**

Mooting is one of the key practices in almost all Law Schools in India. School of Excellence in Law has established a MOOT COURT ASSOCIATION during the year 2008 with a view to promote skills in advocacy and legal writing among the students of the School of Excellence in Law.

### **Debating Association [DA]**

The Debating Association of the University is handled by the students with support and guidance from the faculty, to encourage students to participate in international, national, state and local level debating, essay and oratorical competitions.

### **MEASURES OF SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC JUSTICE**

#### **Waiving of Fee for SC/ST, Differently abled and First Graduates from a family**

Differently Abled candidates on submission of appropriate certificates issued by the concerned authorities are **exempted** from paying **Tuition Fee and Special Fee**. Candidates belonging to SC/ST communities, on submission of community certificates issued by the appropriate authority are **exempted** from paying **Tuition Fee**. They have to pay only the Special Fee at the time of Admission. In respect of First Graduates from a family, the University will refund the Tuition Fee, collected from the respective candidate, on receipt of the same from the Government to the concerned student, on submission of First Graduate Certificate issued by the appropriate authority at the time of admission.

Totally there are 165 Research Scholars presently pursuing their research in this University. From among them, 47 are doing Full-time Research and 118 are doing Part-time Research. ### **Chair of Excellence on Consumer Law and Jurisprudence**

The Chair of Excellence on Consumer Law and Jurisprudence named after late Shri.A.K.Venkata Subramaniam, a former Secretary, Government of India and a Consumer Activist, has been functioning since 01-07- 2014 under the aegis of Department of Consumer Affairs, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, Government of India. The objectives of the Chair, among others, are (i) to provide for the advancement and dissemination of knowledge of law and their role in the development of better education; (ii) to promote legal education and well-being of the community generally and (iii) to provide access to legal education of large segments of the population and in particular to the disadvantaged groups. The Chair periodically conducts National Level Workshops and Seminars on contemporary consumer related issues. In the academic year 2017-18, the Chair organised a National Seminar on 'GST and the Consumer: Issues and Challenges' on 15<sup>th</sup> September, 2017 wherein more than 200 delegates from all walks of life attended. A Consumer Awareness Rally was also organised from the new campus of Tamil Nadu Dr.Ambedkar Law University, Chennai to Elliot's Beach, Besant Nagar, Chennai on 24<sup>th</sup> December, 2017 on the occasion of National Consumer Rights Day. With the aim of instilling the consumer spiritedness among the law college students, State Level Elocution Competition [in Tamil and English] was organised for the law college students on 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> January, 2018 on the topics of "What changes are necessary in the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 to make it more effective?" and "The role of Legal Fraternity in the effective implementation of Consumer Protection Act, 1986" in Tamil and English respectively. As a measure of exploring the legal acumen in the subject of Consumer Law, State Level Moot Court Competition was conducted on 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> February, 2018. A Workshop on Awareness cum Sensitization about Insurance Services was conducted on 10<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 in association with the Office of the Insurance Ombudsman to sensitise the consumers about the various types of insurances and the issues involved in the speedy settlement of claims. The Chair also organised a National Level Workshop on 'Consumer Rights in Digital Market: Need for Fair Play' on 15<sup>th</sup> March, 2018 on the occasion of World Consumer Rights Day. The Chair is also having a number of activities in its Action Plan to be done in the current academic year(2018-19).

## 5 YEAR B.C.A.LL.B. [HONS.] DEGREE COURSE

### Course Structure

The Tamil Nadu Dr.Ambedkar Law University introduced B.C.A.LL.B.[Hons.] Degree Course, from the academic year 2015-2016. The duration of the course is for five years. Each academic year is divided into 2 semesters and each semester consists of 90 working days. B.C.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Degree will be awarded on successful completion of the course. No split degree will be issued during the pursuance or on exit in the midst of the 5 year integrated course.

### Intake

The number of students to be admitted to the 5 Year B.C.A.LL.B.(Hons.) Degree Course shall be **156** (inclusive of NRI). All efforts will be taken to pay individual attention on every student.

### NRI Quota

Out of the total number of seats 15% has been earmarked for NRI candidates. Unfilled seats of NRI will be given to merits.

### Eligible Qualification

Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) or equivalent examination with Computer Science subject alone are eligible to apply. They should have secured not less than 70% of the total marks in the aggregate of all the subjects.

The candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe communities should have secured not less than 60% of the total marks in the aggregate of all subjects.

In case of students, who make a claim under the Non-Resident Indian (NRI) category, they should have secured not less than 70% in the qualifying examination.

The candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe communities should have secured not less than 55% of the total marks in the aggregate of all subjects.

Non-Resident Indian (NRI) candidate should have secured a minimum of 60% of the total marks in the aggregate of all subjects.

**SELECTION PROCEDURE FOR 5 YEAR HONOURS DEGREE COURSES:**

The candidates applying for admission to the B.A.LL.B.[Hons.], B.Com.LL.B.[Hons.], B.B.A. LL.B. [Hons.] and B.C.A.LL.B.[Hons.] Degree Courses will be ranked according to the marks obtained by them in their qualifying examination excluding languages in Parts I & II and also on the basis of communal and special reservation as is prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu (G.O.Ms.No.83 Law (LS) Department dt.19.04.2007).

**SELECTION PROCEDURE FOR 3 YEAR LL.B.[HONS.] DEGREE COURSE:**

Selection for the candidates applying for LL.B.[Hons.] Degree Course will be based on "the percentage of marks obtained by the candidate in aggregate of all the subjects in the qualifying degree examination, excluding languages, may be taken into account. In case where the language alone is the subject of the qualifying examination, the percentage of marks obtained by the candidate in the said examination may be taken into account" (G.O.Ms.No.83 Law (LS) Department dt.19.04.2007).

"All the subjects in the qualifying examinations" means and includes all the Main/Major and Allied/Ancillary subjects of the qualifying degree and marks secured in those subjects taken for classification for class awarding purpose shall alone be taken for ranking purpose.

**NOTE:** Copy of the Consolidated Mark Statement shall be enclosed Compulsorily . In cases where grades are provided, it is the responsibility of candidates to obtain and enclose the equivalent conversion of marks from the University/college concerned. If a candidate fails to produce exact marks secured, the least mark for the concern grade shall be taken into consideration for eligibility and ranking purpose.

The applications will be scrutinized and the Rank List will be published in the notice board of the University. It can also be browsed on the University's website [www.tndalu.ac.in](http://www.tndalu.ac.in). **Criteria for Assessment of Merit**

Admission to the 5 year B.A.LL.B.[Hons.], B.Com.LL.B.[Hons.], B.B.A.LL.B.[Hons.] and B.C.A.LL.B.[Hons.] Degree Courses are made on the basis of merit assessed on the following criteria, as per the G.O.Ms.No.83 LAW (LS) DEPARTMENT dt.19.04.2007.

For 5 year B.A.LL.B.[Hons.], B.Com.LL.B.[Hons.], B.B.A.LL.B.[Hons.] and B.C.A.LL.B. [Hons.] Degree Course, "the percentage of marks obtained by the candidates in the Plus Two examinations in aggregate of all the subjects, excluding languages, will be taken into account. The marks obtained by the students in the Plus Two examinations in the first attempt alone may be taken into account and the marks obtained by them in the improvement examinations shall not be taken into account".

**NORMALISATION PROCESS**

Since, the marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination excluding languages being taken into account and since the qualifying examinations are being conducted by various Boards or Authority, the marks obtained by the candidates of various Boards or Authority shall be equated by the marks obtained by the candidates in the same subjects in the qualifying examination conducted by the State Board by adopting the method of normalization. In this process the highest mark obtained by the students of various Boards in each subject shall be equated to the highest marks obtained by the students of State Board in that subject and the relative marks obtained by other students in the subject shall be determined accordingly.

**Illustration:** If the highest marks secured by the student of State Board in Physics is 100 and the highest mark secured by a student of any other Board in the same subject is 90, both the highest marks will be considered to be equal to 100. If a student of the other Board secures 60 marks in Physics when the first mark in Physics in the same Board is 90, the 60 marks will be considered to be equal to 66.66 marks as arrived at below:

$$\left\{ \frac{100 \times 60}{90} = 66.66\% \right\}$$

**Tie:** In the event of a "tie" in regard to the marks obtained by the students for admission to the law courses, the following order of priority may be followed to determine the rank of the candidates -

- (a) Date of Birth (Elder to be given preference)
- (b) By Lot

Selection shall be made under seven categories namely OC, BC(O) BC(M), MBC & DNC, SC(O), SC(A) and ST as per the rules of reservation prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu:

**Note:** Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered for communal reservations. The list of communities who are eligible to avail the reservation is appended in **Annexure-I**.

Candidates seeking admission against ST/SC(O)/SC[A]/MBC and DNC/BC(O)/BC[M] quota should obtain the certificates of social status issued by the competent authority in the prescribed Permanent Community Card in Tamil Nadu and enclose a self-attested Photo copy of the same along with the application.

The applicants from Tamil Nadu State should have a valid permanent community certificate in the card format issued by the competent authority for ST, SC, MBC/DNC and BC in the format prescribed by the Government of Tamil Nadu in G.O. Ms. No. 781 (Revenue Department) dated: 02.05.1988. This is applicable for BC (O) and BC(M) also. In the case of ST candidates, the community certificate should have been issued by the Revenue Divisional Officer/P.A. (General) to the Collector of Chennai/Sub-Collector of the District concerned (except Chennai) vide Govt. Lr.No.32061/ADWII/89-2, dt:27.12.1989 and Lr.No.21424/ADWII/94-4, dt: 15.11.1994 from the Secretary to Government, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, Chennai - 600 009. The Permanent Community Certificate Card issued to ST candidates by Tahsildars upto 11.11.1989 only is valid. Community certificate obtained from other States will not be considered for communal reservation. For communities linked with districts (See Annexure-I) the candidates should obtain their community certificate in the respective districts except the communities mentioned in the G.O. (st) No. 95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department dt: 28.10.2009. Community certificate obtained from other than the respective district will not be considered. If a candidate belongs to any one of Code No. Column No. 6 & 7 in the application he/she should furnish a self-attested photo copy of Permanent Community Card Certificate.

Candidates who have not furnished a self-attested photo copy of the Permanent Community Card Certificate at the time of submission of the application will be treated as belonging to 'General Category (OC)'. The eligibility conditions and rules prescribed for General Category will be applicable for such candidates and if they do not satisfy the rules of 'General Category (OC)', their applications are liable to be rejected. No correspondence in this connection will be entertained. ST/SC(O)/SC[A]/MBC&DNC/BC(O)/BC[M] candidates are also eligible for selection under Open Competition [O.C.] in addition to the reservations made for them.

**Reservation under Special Category:**

1. **Children of Ex-Servicemen - 1%** (candidates who claim reservation under Children of Ex-Servicemen Category should produce the evidence as per the enclosed format provided for such candidates). (Refer Annexure I for Caste Code & Annexure II for Special Category Code).
2. **Children of Freedom Fighter - 1%** (candidates who claim reservation under Children of Freedom Fighter Category should produce the relevant document).
3. **Differently abled persons - 5%** (candidates who claim special reservation under differently abled category should have disability of 40% and above) Among the 5% reserved, 1% each will be allotted to 1.Blindness and low vision 2.Deaf and hard hearing 3.Locomotordisability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy 4.Autism, intellectual disability, specific learning disability and mental illness 5.Multiple disabilities form amongst persons under clauses (1) to (4) including deaf-blindness in the programme identified for each disabilities respectively.
4. **Eminent Sports Persons - 1%** (candidates who claim reservation under Sports category should produce relevant documents). Please refer the enclosed format.

Admission will be made purely on the basis of Merit, Communal Reservations, Special Category Reservations and as per the Government Orders.

### **Prohibition of Ragging**

As per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, UGC and Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997, Ragging is an offence, and is banned in the Institutions. Anyone indulging in Ragging is liable to be punished with rigorous imprisonment upto 3 years, and or fine upto Rs.25,000/-, besides expulsion from the Institution. As per UGC norms, the University has constituted the ANTI RAGGING COMMITTEE. Students affected due to ragging can approach the Committee members and the committee will ensure strict compliance of Anti - Ragging measures in the Law University.

### **ADMISSION UNDER NRI QUOTA**

Admission to the NRI quota will be made in the following order and as per merit on the basis of marks secured by the candidate in the qualifying examination.

**Category I - NRI Parent :** The NRI should be a Parent (Father or Mother)

**Category II - NRI Guardian:** If the candidate has no Parent where he / she has been taken as a ward by a nearby relative or someone and such NRI Guardian has been legally declared as the Guardian of the Candidate by the Court as per provision of Guardians and Wards Act, 1890.

- In each and every category, candidates will be selected based only on *inter se merit*.

Candidates must furnish the self-attested photo copies of the following documents along with the filled in application or upload the documents those who are applying through online process

- i. NRI status certificate issued by the Indian Embassy of the respective Country with seal.
- ii. Copy of the NRE (Non Resident External) or NRO Bank Account Pass Book of the NRI.
- iii. Copy of the Valid Passport of the NRI.
- iv. Certificate of relationship (between the NRI (Guardian) and the Candidate issued by the Competent Authority).
- v. Employment Certificate of the NRI. [In case of Self-Employment, nature of the business, annual income and required proof of Income-Tax payment (for the last 3 years)].
- vi. Qualifying Mark / Grade list of the candidate.
- vii. Certificate showing that the candidate has proficiency in English Language.
- ix. School/ College Transfer Certificate or (Migration Certificate wherever necessary).

The candidates provisionally selected will be admitted only after verification of all original documents. They should surrender all the original certificates at the time of admission for verification. On the date of admission, those candidates who fail to produce all the original certificates referred above, will not be considered for admission. No extension of time will be given for producing the original certificates.

On verification, if any discrepancy between information furnished in the application form and original documents produced, the selection will be cancelled. The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University, Chennai reserves the right to cancel the admission of any candidate for valid reasons.

## POST-GRADUATE COURSES

### LL.M. DEGREE COURSES

The School of Excellence in Law offers Post-Graduate Courses (Regular Programmes) leading to two year LL.M. Degrees, under CBCS pattern, in the following Nine Branches:

1. Branch I: Business Law
2. Branch II: Constitutional Law & Human Rights
3. Branch III: Intellectual Property Law
4. Branch IV: International Law and Organisation
5. Branch V: Environmental Law and Legal Order
6. Branch VI: Criminal Law and Criminal Justice Administration
7. Branch VII: Human Rights and Duties Education
8. Branch VIII: Labour Law & Administrative Law
9. Branch IX: Taxation Law

### Intake and Reservation

The number of students to be admitted in each branch of the LL.M. Degree Course is limited to 20. For each of the branches, the reservation will be based on the State Reservation Policy.

### Eligibility

The general eligibility condition for admission to Master's Degree Programme as per the UGC Regulations 2001, is through completion of formal education in the 10 + 2 + 3 format and candidates with such qualification are eligible to join any one of the Post Graduate programmes offered in SOEL.

Candidates who have successfully completed a three year / five year under-graduate degree course in Law conducted by the University or equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to a Masters Degree programme in any of the LL.M. courses. Candidate should have obtained a minimum of 45% of marks under New Regulations [40% under Old Regulations]. Candidates who are awaiting results may also apply.

### Course Structure & Duration

LL.M. Degree Course is offered at the University under CBCS pattern and is of two years duration. Each academic year is divided into 2 semesters (odd semester from July to November and even semester from December to April). Each semester consists of 90 working days. A semester normally extends over a period of 15 weeks, each week has 30 hours of instruction spread over a 5 day week. The semester pattern is designed with continuous assessment system.

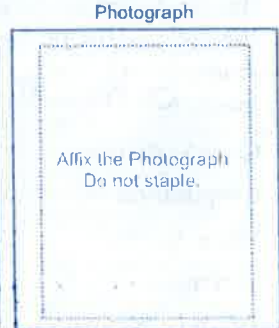




