**Survey (25 Aug 2023)**

Under the able guidance of our NSS program officer **Dr. S. Manjula**, a special meeting was arranged by NSS. All the NSS volunteers from both the Units attended this special meeting which was scheduled on 25<sup>th</sup> August 2023 by 11.30 am at UG Seminar hall, TNDALU. This meeting was presided over by our Program Officer **Dr. S. Manjula** and NSS Faculty Coordinator **Dr. A. Martina**. Around 200 students were present on the meeting and this meet exclusively focused on the guidelines in conducting NEET survey and about the pathetic situation that our youths of the nation face today.



## BRIEFING THE NATURE OF WORK

In this meeting, Students were enlightened about the importance of employment and livelihood in present world. Our NSS Faculty Coordinator **Dr. A. Martina**, gave basic insights about the process of data collection in conducting the survey. Madam gave ideas to the students in their way of approaching the people for data collection and their code of conduct in performing the survey. In her deliberation, she focused on various steps to follow in completing the survey in minimum time with maximum information gained from the end.



## DATA COLLECTION AND SAMPLE SELECTION

Our NSS program officer **Dr. S. Manjula**, has explained about the way of data collection and about the sample selection techniques. She detailed the category of NEET in broader sense that includes House wives, drop out in college and school, discontinued under this ambit. The types of sample selection gave an idea to the volunteers in choosing their target audience in successful completion of the survey.



The purpose for conducting the NEET survey was explained to the volunteers where their ultimate aim is to record maximum responses under this survey. By which, our youth's position in the country shall be studied and our Government of India shall make any necessary changes for their employment opportunities.

## FIELD WORK AND ITS PRECAUTIONS

The result for this noble cause shall be ensured by filling appropriate information in right way so that it could be easy for processing. The instructions for duly filling in the survey forms were explained to the volunteers by our NSS Student Coordinator **Mast. Aswin Kumar. K**, the procedure for input and codes for answer were analyzed and briefed to the students in most understanding way.



Each and every question were explained to them in broader sense such that it could avoid chaos and misunderstanding in completing the task. **Program officer Dr. S. Manjula and Faculty Coordinator Dr. A. Martina** also cleared student's doubts and encouraged them in completing the task.

All the **1000 forms** received from NSS regional directorate were divided and distributed among our NSS volunteers from both the Units I and II. Students started their work the very next day onwards in choosing the samples around their localities and recorded their responses. After giving reasonable time period for completing the survey, Our NSS team again collected the duly filled in survey forms back from the volunteers.
