


WINNERS - 17TH RAJ ANAND MOOT COURT COMPETITION, 2023


The team comprising of **Sindhanaa Andavan**, **Yeseswini** and **Mirudhula** from School of Excellence in Law, Chennai was adjudged as 'WINNERS' in the 17th Raj Anand Moot Court - The Indian Science Inventions Competition, 2023 conducted by the renowned Anand and Anand firm.

The team was awarded with the Rolling Trophy (made out of a fossil), Cash Prize of Rs. 2,00,000 and a one-month internship opportunity at Anand and Anand firm, Delhi. The competition was based on Law of Patents.

The prelims round was judged by Hon'ble Mrs. Justice Mukta Gupta, Former Judge of High Court of Delhi and Mr. Yashwant Dev Panwar, Head of Patent Facilitation Centre, New Delhi.

The final round was adjudged by Hon'ble Mr. Justice C. Hari Shankar and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Amit Bansal of Delhi High Court, in which the team emerged as 'Winners'. The Team received the Trophy and cash prize from the hands of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Manmohan and Hon'ble Mr. Justice Najmi Waziri of Delhi High Court.
