





Distribution of Courses




How do you rate the Syllabus of the Course that you have gone through in relation to the expected outcome of the Course?








How do you rate the various papers in terms of their relevance to the specialization streams? 456 responses














How do you rate various provisions for extension and Co-Curricular and Extra -Curricular activities of the institution?

Overall rating of the Program and various facilities in the institution










How do you rate the Syllabus of the Course that you have gone through in relation to the expected outcome of the Course?




How do you rate the allocation of credits and hours to the Courses? 48 responses




How do you rate the various papers in terms of their relevance to the specialization streams? 48 responses




Teaching methods followed by teachers?










How do you rate various provisions for extension and Co-Curricular and Extra -Curricular activities of the institution?

FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT

I. Curriculum and Syllabus

• Key Findings:

- Students generally expressed satisfaction with the curriculum's relevance to their academic and career goals.
- o While appreciating the clarity of the syllabus, some students suggested improvements in the clarity of course objectives and assessment criteria.
- Students emphasized the importance of interactive teaching methods and realworld applications.
- Flexibility in the curriculum to accommodate diverse learning styles and interests was highlighted as a key area for improvement.

• Action Points:

- Curriculum Review and Revision: Conduct a comprehensive review of course content and learning objectives to ensure alignment with industry standards and student needs.
- Enhanced Communication: Improve communication channels between faculty and students by providing detailed course outlines, assessment rubrics, and clear expectations.
- Pedagogical Innovation: Encourage and support faculty in implementing innovative teaching methods, such as active learning strategies, case studies, and simulations.
- Curricular Flexibility: Explore options for expanding elective offerings, interdisciplinary programs, and experiential learning opportunities.

• Student Satisfaction:

- A high percentage of students (over 90%) rated the allocation of credits and hours to courses as "good" or "excellent."
- Most students (over 90%) were satisfied with the relevance of course content to their specialization streams.
- A small percentage (9.3%) expressed dissatisfaction with the relevance of some courses.

II. Teaching Methodology & Assessment Strategies

• Key Findings:

o Students appreciated well-structured lectures and presentations, especially when

- supplemented with multimedia resources.
- Active learning experiences, such as group discussions and case studies, were highly valued.
- Timely and constructive feedback, along with open communication channels with instructors, were identified as crucial for student learning and growth.
- Students expressed a desire for greater diversity in assessment methods, including presentations, portfolios, and projects.

Action Points:

- Pedagogical Training: Invest in faculty development programs to enhance pedagogical skills and promote the use of innovative teaching methods.
- Active Learning Integration: Encourage and support faculty in incorporating a variety of active learning strategies into their teaching.
- Enhanced Feedback Mechanisms: Implement robust feedback mechanisms, including structured feedback protocols and technology-enabled platforms, to facilitate effective communication between instructors and students.
- Assessment Diversity: Explore and implement diverse assessment methods that evaluate a range of skills and competencies, such as presentations, portfolios, and projects.

• Student Satisfaction:

- o A majority of students rated the teaching methodology as "good" to "excellent."
- o Students generally appreciated the objectivity of the assessment process.
- o While a small percentage (9.3%) expressed dissatisfaction with assessment methods, the overall response indicates a high level of student satisfaction.

III. Learning Resources, Facilities, and Guidance

• Key Findings:

- Students appreciated the availability of library resources, including print materials, online databases, and digital collections.
- Access to reliable technology infrastructure, including computer labs, Wi-Fi connectivity, and software applications, was deemed crucial.
- The availability of dedicated study spaces, group study rooms, and collaborative workspaces was valued by students.
- Students emphasized the importance of personalized academic advising and guidance.

• Action Points:

- Library Resource Enhancement: Enhance library resources by expanding access to electronic databases, updating collections, and improving user-friendliness.
- Technology Infrastructure Upgrades: Invest in and maintain up-to-date technology infrastructure, including reliable Wi-Fi connectivity and wellequipped computer labs.
- Study Space Optimization: Assess and enhance the utilization of existing study spaces, considering student needs and preferences.
- Advisor Training and Support: Provide professional development opportunities for academic advisors to enhance their skills and effectively support student needs.

• Student Satisfaction:

- A high percentage of students (over 90%) expressed satisfaction with the availability and accessibility of learning resources and facilities.
- Student satisfaction with academic advising and support services was also high,
 with a majority expressing positive feedback.

IV. Overall Impression

- Overall, 96.1% of students expressed satisfaction with the programs and facilities offered by the university. This positive feedback indicates that TNDALU has successfully fulfilled its mission to provide a high-quality educational experience.
- Student satisfaction, being a key indicator of institutional effectiveness, demonstrates that the university has effectively addressed the needs and expectations of its student body.


















The Curriculum contains a wide range of Courses under Choice Base Credit System ²⁸ responses












Accessibility of the teacher for parents in the Department






Usefulness of the outreach Programme 88 responses




Standard of the Internal Assessment Test and Semester Examination are 88 responses



I. NEED-BASED IMPORTANCE OF THE CURRICULUM

The curriculum serves as the cornerstone of our academic programs, guiding students through a structured pathway of learning. Understanding and addressing the needs of our students is paramount in shaping a curriculum that is relevant, engaging, and impactful.

Key Findings:

- Career Alignment: Students strongly emphasized the importance of a curriculum that aligns with their career aspirations and future goals. They expressed a strong desire for courses and learning experiences that equip them with practical skills, industry-relevant knowledge, and opportunities for professional development.
- Adaptability to Changing Trends: Students highlighted the need for a curriculum that is adaptable
 and responsive to the dynamic and evolving societal, technological, and economic landscape.
 They emphasized the importance of incorporating emerging topics, interdisciplinary perspectives,
 and innovative pedagogies to ensure future-readiness.
- Diversity and Inclusivity: Students stressed the importance of a curriculum that reflects diversity, inclusivity, and multicultural perspectives. They called for the inclusion of diverse voices, experiences, and cultural contexts across all disciplines to promote a more comprehensive understanding of global issues and perspectives.
- Holistic Development: Beyond academic knowledge and technical skills, students emphasized
 the importance of a curriculum that supports holistic development, including critical thinking,
 communication skills, emotional intelligence, and ethical reasoning. They emphasized the need
 for experiential learning opportunities, community engagement initiatives, and opportunities for
 personal growth and self-reflection.

Action Points:

- Stakeholder Collaboration: TNDALU will actively engage stakeholders, including students, faculty, alumni, and industry partners, in the curriculum development process to ensure that it reflects the evolving needs of diverse stakeholders and remains responsive to changing societal and industry demands.
- Curricular Flexibility: TNDALU will explore opportunities to enhance curricular flexibility, allowing students to tailor their academic pathways to their unique interests, goals, and learning styles. This may include introducing elective courses, interdisciplinary programs, and customizable learning experiences.
- Diversity and Inclusion Initiatives: TNDALU will prioritize efforts to promote diversity, inclusivity, and multicultural perspectives within the curriculum. This may involve reviewing course content, incorporating diverse authors and perspectives, and fostering an inclusive learning environment that celebrates cultural diversity and promotes social justice.
- Holistic Development Framework: TNDALU will adopt a holistic development framework that
 integrates academic learning with personal and professional growth. This may involve the

integration of experiential learning opportunities, leadership development initiatives, and wellness programs into the curriculum to support the holistic development of students.

II. Clarity of Course Objectives

Clarity of course objectives is crucial for effective feedback mechanisms.

• Key Considerations:

- Alignment with Feedback: Feedback provided to students should directly relate to the stated objectives of the course. This helps students understand how their performance aligns with the intended learning outcomes.
- Measurable Outcomes: Course objectives should be measurable and specific to allow for targeted feedback and assessment.
- Feedback Criteria: Establish clear criteria for providing feedback, such as grading rubrics or assessment guidelines, to ensure consistent and meaningful evaluation.
- Encourage Dialogue: Foster open dialogue between instructors and students regarding course objectives and feedback received to clarify any misunderstandings and enhance the learning experience.

• Faculty Perspective:

86.4% of faculty members rated the clarity of course objectives as "excellent," while
 13.6% rated them as "very good," indicating a high level of clarity and alignment in the
 current curriculum.

III. Effectiveness of Course Contents and Activities

• Key Findings:

- Faculty members (77.8% "maximum range," 22.2% "very good") believe that the current curriculum effectively enables students to develop skills beyond the core course content, such as analytical, logical, technical, and creative skills.
- 74.1% of faculty members rated the balance between theory and clinical practice as "maximum range," and 25.9% rated it as "very good," indicating a strong emphasis on practical learning.
- o 66.7% of faculty members rated the effectiveness of student motivation to utilize university and external resources for effective learning as "maximum range," while 33.3% rated it as "next best range."

IV. Teaching-Learning Assessment

• Faculty Perspective: 75% of faculty members believe that the current teaching-learning assessment methods are in the "maximum best range," while the remaining 25% believe they are "optimally good." This indicates a high level of satisfaction with the current assessment practices.

Conclusion

This feedback analysis provides valuable insights into the strengths and areas for improvement in the current curriculum and teaching-learning processes. By carefully considering these findings and implementing the recommended action points, TNDALU can continue to enhance the quality of its educational programs and ensure that our students are well-prepared for success in their future endeavours.

Alumni evaluation provides valuable insights into the long-term effectiveness of educational programs. Their feedback can contribute to:








Whether studied U.G.in SOEL?




Whether studied P.G.in SOEL?








How would you like to rate the Course in imparting practical knowledge? 22 responses




How would you like to rate the Course Content and its scope for development of analytical, logical, technical and creative skills to the students?




