# INTRA UNIVERSITY MOOT COURT COMPETITION

*9th August, 2023 to 12th August, 2023*

## AIM AND PURPOSE:

The Intra University Intellectual Property Law Moot Court Competition, 2023 has been organised with the aim to inculcate interest in Intellectual Property Law and understand the various issues concerning the same. Participation was strictly restricted to bona fide law students enrolled in the three-year or five-year integrated LL.B. course of the School of Excellence in Law, The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University. The Competition was set to take place in the School of Excellence in Law, The Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University premises (Perungudi Campus).

The Intra University Intellectual Property Law Moot Court Competition, 2023, was an intellectually stimulating and academically enriching event. Organized with the aim of nurturing an interest in Intellectual Property Law among law students, the competition provided a platform for participants to showcase their legal skills and engage in rigorous legal discourse.

The Researcher Test, held on August 9, 2023, challenged participants with 25 objective-type questions and 5 subjective questions, further testing their knowledge and analytical skills.

# PRO BONO ENVIRO NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION

## **ABOUT THE PRO BONO ENVIRO MOOT COMPETITION:**

The Moot Court Association [MCA] of the School of Excellence in Law, Chennai was established in the year 2008 with the view to promote oral advocacy skills and legal writing techniques. The foremost endeavor of the MCA is to develop and encourage mooting. Our flagship Competition, the Pro Bono Enviro National Moot Court Competition conducted annually since 2007 in collaboration with the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, is the first Competition in the country to address environmental issues. This moot encourages students to expand their awareness of environmental concerns in the present world. The 17<sup>th</sup> Pro Bono Enviro National Moot Court Competition witnessed a total registration of 38 teams of various universities and colleges, more than 110 students took part in the competition.

## **RESEARCHER'S TEST: (23.09.2023)**

The MCA SOEL conducts a unique way of conducting Researcher's Interview by making participants questioned by a Judge in a one-on-one manner. This

interview was conducted via the “Google Meet” application and the researchers were questioned by the judging panel to test their knowledge on the given facts and laws revolving around it.

**PRELIMINARY ROUNDS AND OCTA FINALS:**

The Preliminary rounds were conducted in online mood via the “Google Meet” application on 24.09.2023. Whatsapp groups were created by the ushers to send communications, instructions and to guide the team throughout the competition. There were 38 teams participating against each other, out of which the top 16 teams from the Preliminary Rounds advanced to the Octafinals. The qualification of the top 16 teams were based on aggregate scores of the judging panel and in the event of tie, the memorandum score of the teams were considered.

The Octa finals were conducted in offline mode, where the top 16 qualifying teams had to come in physical mode on 14.10.2023. They were requested to avail the accommodation provided and send the travel details. The qualification of teams to the Quarter-finals was on a knock-out basis and the memorandum scores were not considered in the advanced rounds.

**QUARTERFINALS:**

The Quarter Finals were conducted in offline mode on 14.10.2023 for the top 8 qualifying teams from the Octa finals. The top 8 teams advancing to the Quarter Finals were selected on a knock-out basis.

The teams that advanced to this round were Danube, Irrawady, Tocantius, Yellow, Orinoco, Chulym, Indus, and Aldan. They were from Sastra Deemed University, Tamil Nadu National Law University, Saveetha School of Law-Chennai, Mar Gregorios College of Law-Trivandrum, Symbiosis Law School-Noida, Alliance University-Bangalore, National University of Advanced Legal Studies-Kochi and Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University respectively.

The top 4 teams of the quarter-final rounds were selected for the semi-finals on a knock-out basis.

**SEMI-FINALS:**

The Semi-Finals were conducted in offline mode on 15.10.2023 for the top 4 qualifying teams from the Quarter Finals. The top 4 teams advancing from the Quarter Finals to the Semi-Finals were selected on a knock-out basis. The teams that advanced to the Semi-finals were Orinocco, Irrawaddy, Yellow, and Aldan. They were from Symbiosis Law School-Noida, Tamil Nadu National Law University, Mar Gregorios College of Law-Trivandrum, and

Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University respectively. The top 2 teams of the Semi-Final rounds advanced to the Finals on a knock-out basis.

### **FINALS:**

The Finals were conducted in offline mode on 15.10.2023 for the top 2 qualifying teams from the Semi-Finals. The much-awaited Final Rounds of the 17<sup>th</sup> Pro Bono Enviro National Moot Court Competition, 2023 was conducted between Government law college Salem and symbiosis law school Noida. The Final round was judged by an esteemed five judges panel of Hon'ble Justice and Respected Advocates. The teams witnessed an eminent judging panel comprising Hon'ble Justice Mr. Seshayee, Senior Advocate Mr. Raghavachari, Advocate Mr. Vikram Raman, Advocate Mr. Minnah Joshi, and Advocate Mr. Sai Sathya Jith. 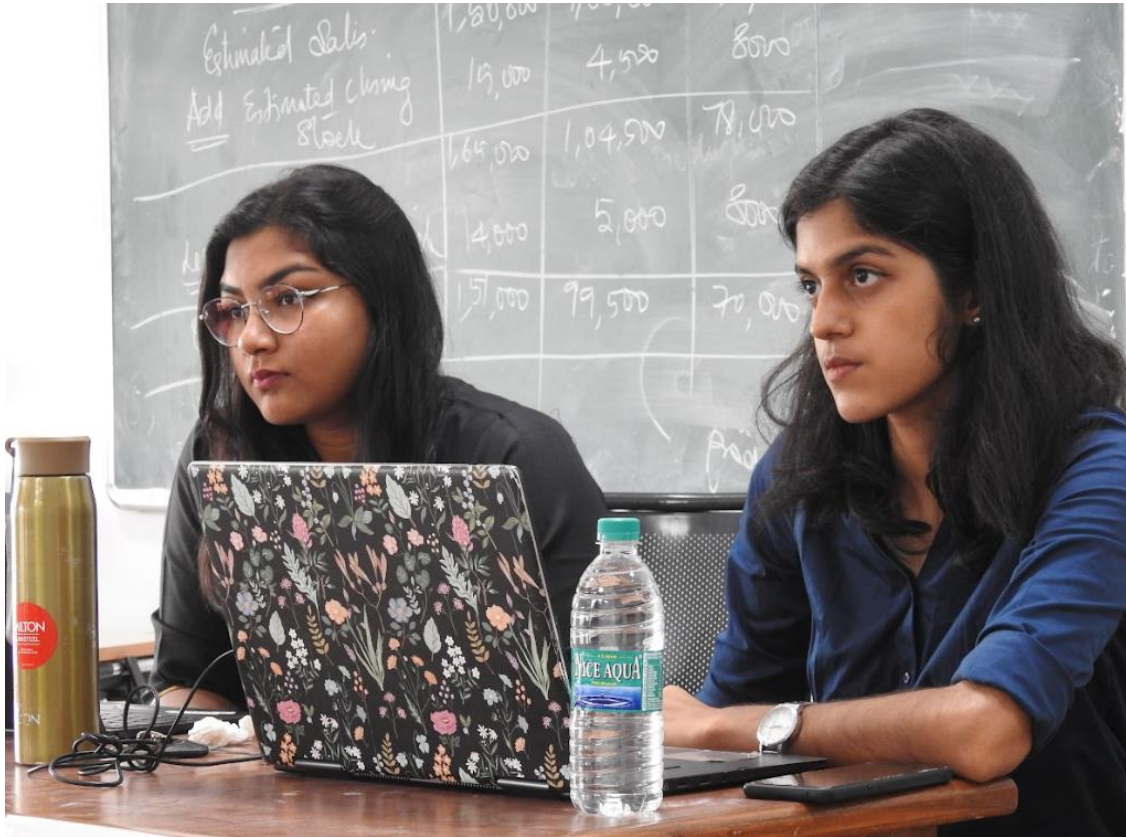

## ABOUT THE FRESHER'S MOOT:

Moot court is a primary law school activity, to indulge in, which is the dream of every law student. A moot court is a "mock court" where a hypothetical case is argued by law students in front of a panel of judges. Mooting is a specialised application of the art of persuasive advocacy. Mooting not only helps the students to improve their research and speaking skills, but also enables them to appreciate the law by applying it to the facts of the case.

The fresher's Moot Court Competition was a simulation of the actual Moot Court Competition. The primary difference between Freshers Moot and an actual moot is that every student was required to participate individually by formulating and preparing the memorial and arguments by themselves and deliver the arguments.

Understanding the complexity of this for the freshers, each participant was allotted with a mentor who helped and guided them throughout the competition in various aspects. The complexity of the competition was reduced by allowing the students to participate individually without any opposing counsel which did not require them to answer any rebuttals and sur rebuttals.

### **ABOUT THE FRESHER'S ORIENTATION:**

The Fresher's Moot Court Orientation 2023-24 for 3 years LLB course was conducted on 18th January ,2024. It was conducted in an online mode via google meet from 11 am. The guest speaker for the day was Adv Mohammad Sajid, BBA MA LLB (Hons), Alumni of SOEL.

The emcee for the day gave a brief intro of Adv Mohammad Sajid. He is the ever humble and commendable alumni of the Tamilnadu Dr.Ambedkar Law University, Mr. Mohammed Sajid, who has worked as a fine member of the

MCA and has bagged awards in various Moot Court Competitions. He has also won the Best Male Advocate Award from the Honorable Judges of Madras High court.

The President of moot court association, Ms. Nishasri explained about how MCA functions. The Guest speaker gave a significant lecture on importance of mooting and explained mooting procedures. He also underlined the importance of participating in fresher's moot. The key takeaways from his lecture was that fresher's moot is to ensure that they fulfill the roles of both a researcher and a speaker in the competition, typically undertaken by two different individuals. The event drew significant interest, with a total of 80 registrations, reflecting the enthusiasm of the freshers. The event was conducted in 2 court halls with 40 participants who actively engaged in the competition, showcasing their legal acumen and advocacy skills. The format of the event was to induct top 3 winners into the Moot Court Association.

Each Court Hall consisted of a Division Bench. The participants were to argue only the designated role and there were no rebuttals. Each participant was given 12 minutes to present their arguments and to answer the questions posed by the Judges.

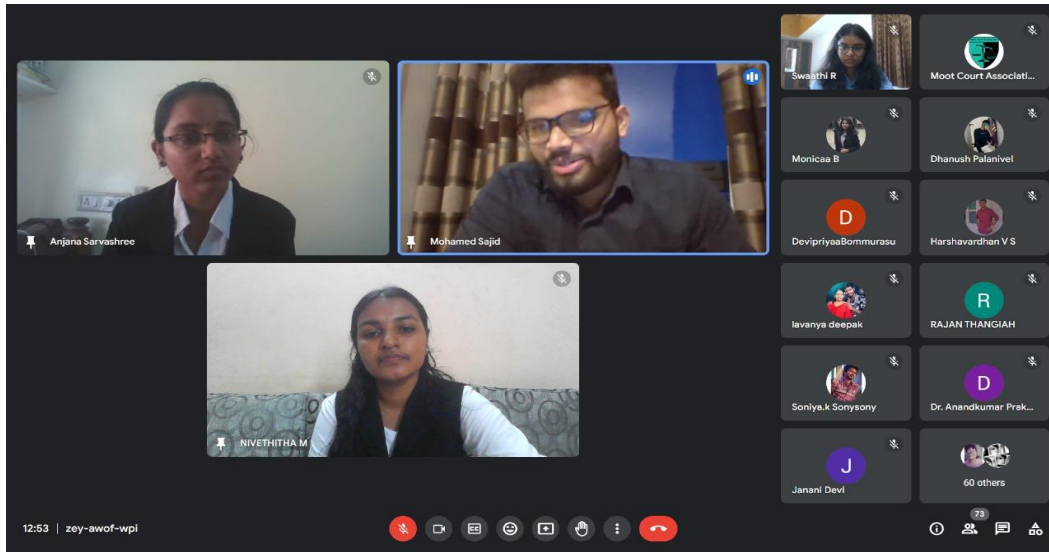
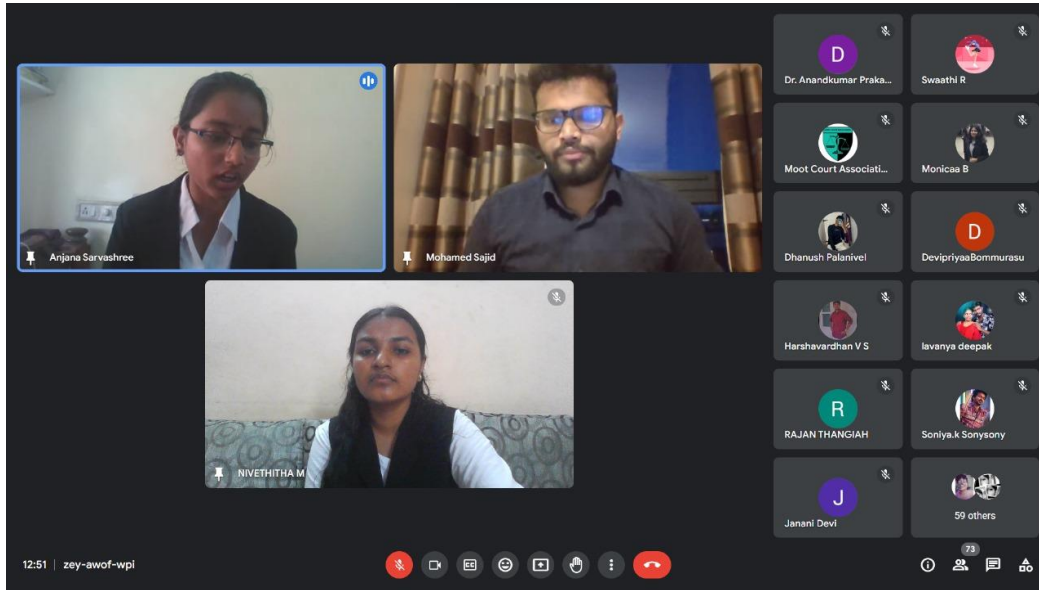

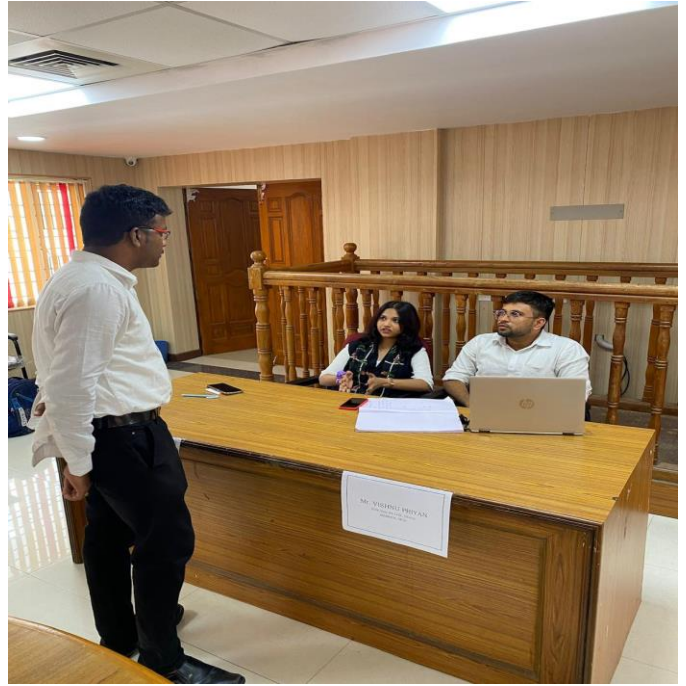

# K R RAMAMANI TAXATION NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION

## INTRODUCTION:

The 14th KR Ramamani Memorial National Taxation Moot Court Competition, 2024 was organized by the Moot Court Association, School of Excellence in Law, Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University in association with Subbaraya Aiyar, Padmanabhan and Ramamani (S.A.P.R.) Advocates. It was conducted in Hybrid mode on the 9th and 10th of February and 10th of March, 2024.

## REGISTRATIONS:

The registration period for the competition was open from December 25th, 2023 to January 14th, 2024. The competition garnered interest from various regions across the country, with a total of 31 teams that registered from various locations across the country. Teams hailed from several regions all the way from New Delhi in the North to Villupuram in the South. We were excited to see such a diverse range of teams apply from across the nation and we anticipated a strong competition with many talented teams participating.

## ROUNDS:

The competition was conducted in Hybrid mode, with the Preliminary and Quarter-finals rounds virtually and the Semi-Finals and Finals in offline mode in the Taramani Campus of School of Excellence in Law.

### 1. Preliminary Rounds:

- The Preliminary rounds featured **31** teams and one Home-team participating through Google Meet on *09th February, 2024*.
- The prelims had **16** practicing advocates and **16** renowned chartered accountants as the judges with each court hall having one advocate and one chartered accountant as the bench.
- Each team was given a total of 20 minutes to submit their arguments, which was followed by a rebuttal session.
- The teams were allowed to present on both the sides of the moot problem.

### 2. Quarter-final rounds:

- The **top 8 teams** from the Preliminary rounds were selected based on their aggregate scores.
- The qualifying teams' Team Codes and University names are:

  - ii. **Aquarius** – Symbiosis Law School, Noida

- The teams were given 30 minutes to submit their arguments before a two-judge bench comprising of an advocate and a chartered accountant in a total of 8 court halls.
- The teams were allowed to represent only one side which was determined by draw of lots to assign the 8 Teams to the 4 Court Halls.
- The matchups for the Quarter Final Rounds were

  - ii. Canis Major v. Aquarius
  - iii. Eridanus v. Cetus
  - iv. Scorpius v. Aries

### 3. Semi-Final Rounds:

- The 4 teams that won in their respective court halls during the Quarter-finals had qualified on a knock-out basis for the Semi-Finals which happened on the 10th of March in offline mode at the School of Excellence in Law, Taramani, Chennai.
