UNITE 2030

The UNITE by 2030 to End Violence against Women campaign, launched by the UN Secretary-General in 2008, is a global initiative aimed at eliminating violence against women and girls by the year 2030. This campaign is part of UN Women's broader efforts to raise awareness, mobilize resources, and create systemic change to address the pervasive issue of genderbased violence. It calls on governments, civil society, and individuals to take concrete actions to prevent violence and ensure that survivors have access to justice and support services. The campaign promotes a comprehensive approach that includes prevention, protection, and provision of services. It emphasizes the importance of educating communities, engaging men and boys, strengthening legal frameworks, and supporting survivors through essential services such as healthcare, legal aid, and safe spaces. A key aspect of UNITE is the annual 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence, which runs from November 25 to December 10, encouraging global participation in advocating for gender equality and ending violence. By 2030, the campaign aims to make significant progress toward achieving a world where women and girls live free from violence, as outlined in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 5), particularly Target 5.2, which seeks to eliminate all forms of violence against women and girls.

UNITE Campaign Themes by Year:

2011: End Violence Against Women and Girls

This theme called for global action to end all forms of violence against women and girls, emphasizing their fundamental rights to safety and dignity.

2012: Let's End Violence Against Women. Say You Commit

Encouraged individuals to make personal commitments to act against violence, emphasizing collective responsibility.

2013: End Violence Against Women

Focused on the need for governments, organizations, and individuals to take decisive action to end violence and ensure gender equality.

2014: Orange Your Neighbourhood

This theme urged people to take visible action by "oranging" their neighborhoods to raise awareness about violence against women, using the color orange as a symbol of hope and change.

2015: Prevent Violence Against Women

Shifted the focus to prevention strategies, encouraging efforts to tackle the root causes of violence, such as gender inequality and discrimination.

2016: Invest and Mobilize to End Violence Against Women

Focused on the importance of investment and mobilization of resources, both financial and social, to combat violence against women effectively.

2017: Leave No One Behind

This theme emphasized the need to ensure that all women and girls, including those from marginalized groups, are protected from violence and included in global efforts.

2018: Orange the World: #Hear MeToo

This theme brought attention to the #MeToo movement, highlighting the voices of survivors and calling for accountability and systemic change in addressing gender-based violence.

2019: Generation Equality Stands Against Rape

Focused on addressing sexual violence and rape as part of the broader effort to achieve gender equality and eliminate violence against women.

2020: Orange the World: Fund, Respond, Prevent, Collect!

This theme stressed the need for investment in services, prevention programs, and data collection to better understand and respond to violence against women.

2021: End Violence Against Women Now!

A call to urgently accelerate efforts to end violence against women, especially in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, which had exacerbated the problem.

2022: Activism to End Violence Against Women and Girls

Focused on mobilizing people globally to actively take part in advocacy and actions aimed at ending gender-based violence.

2023: UNITE! Invest to Prevent Violence Against Women and Girls

This year's theme urges governments and citizens to demonstrate a commitment to ending violence by prioritizing investments in prevention, service provision, and support for survivors.

2024: UNITE! Empower to End Violence Against Women and Girls (Proposed)

While the specific theme for 2024 has not been officially released at the time of this writing, it's likely to build upon previous themes with a focus on empowerment—empowering women and girls to take a stand against violence and creating environments where they can thrive without fear.
